Re Philadelphia letter to Bureau, 3/28/72.

On 4/24/72, [redacted], American Association For The Advancement of Science (AAAS), 1515 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C., advised SA [redacted] that AAAS, to his knowledge, does not have a list of the members of SESPA who attended the AAAS Convention, 12/26-30/71, at Philadelphia, nor the names of the disrupters at that convention.

[] stated he regarded SESPA as a rather small organization whose members seem to be mainly opposed to the U.S. Government spending so much money on armaments and the war, inasmuch as they feel that money should be spent on social improvements in this country.

Rerep of SA [Redacted], dated 12/22/71 at Boston, captioned "SCIENTISTS AND ENGINEERS FOR SOCIAL AND POLITICAL ACTION (SESPA), IS - NL".

[Redacted] is an Associate Professor of [Redacted] at the University of Cincinnati, Cincinnati, Ohio. Since 1967, he has been an active participant in loosely organized peace groupings in the Cincinnati area, specifically the Cincinnati Peace Coalition and Cincinnati Action For Peace. There has been no indication that he has been affiliated with any basic revolutionary group or extremist group.

In view of the information set forth in referenced report, that persons within SESPA have openly declared their intentions to disseminate research data to foreign countries, Bureau authority is requested to initiate investigation of subject, which will be conducted within the Manual provisions as set forth for the investigation of faculty members at institutions of higher learning.
