A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on January 13, 1972, that [Redacted] (phonetic) (later identified as [Redacted]) attended a meeting of the Washington Area Peace Action Coalition (WAPAC), the Washington, D.C. (WDC) affiliate of the National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC), held at 1346 Connecticut Avenue, Northwest, WDC, on January 6, 1972, and asked if his organization could borrow the WAPAC mailing list. He stated his organization was called "Scientists and Engineers for Political Action" or "Scientists and Engineers for the People" (S) (U)

The NPAC was founded in 1970 by members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). Its basic objective is to unite masses of people, including labor unions, GIs, and the black community, in the struggle to end United States intervention in Southeast Asia through orderly and peaceful tactics. [Redacted]

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The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450. [Redacted]

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A second source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on January 21, 1972, that [Redacted] Student Identification Number [Redacted], local and permanent address, [Redacted], Maryland, was one of four individuals whose names were on a George Washington University (GWU) Student Organization Registration form, dated September 29, 1971, for a new organization on behalf of Scientists and Engineers for Social and Political Action (SESPA). 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According to the registration form, SESPA's purpose is to "involve people engaged in all aspects of the social and natural sciences to alter present science goals to serve the people and alter the way science is done to make institutions responsible to their people". (u)

The second source stated SESPA is a registered, but not recognized, organization at GWU and has no office. (u)

A third source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, reported on January 21, 1972, that a [redacted] (last name unknown) (later determined to be [redacted]) had been attending WAPAC meetings during the past month, and wanted to use WAPAC's mailing list for the purpose of distributing SESPA pamphlets and leaflets. (u) (u)

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On February 11, 1972, the second source advised that [redacted], GWU Student Number [redacted], was born [redacted] at [redacted], West Virginia, and was admitted to GWU in the spring of 1970. His mother was listed as [redacted], Maryland. (u)

In his application for admittance to GWU, he indicated he had received a B.S. Degree in [redacted] from American University, WDC, in [redacted], and that he had attended the University of Colorado, Boulder, Colorado, from [redacted] to [redacted]. He stated he was in the United States Army from [redacted] to [redacted]. He was seeking a Masters Degree in [redacted] at the time he applied to go to GWU. (u)

By letter dated September 14, 1971, [redacted] was advised by [redacted] at GWU that the Department had recommended that his degree candidacy be terminated. This action was based on [redacted] failure to satisfy the requirements set forth by [redacted], and by [redacted] poor performance in other fields. (u)

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[redacted] last attended GWU in the spring of 1971.

The files of the United States Park Police, WDC, and the Montgomery County, Maryland, Police Department, had no record identifiable with [redacted] as of February 28, 1972.

Records of the Metropolitan Police Department, WDC, when checked on February 28, 1972, disclosed that [redacted] [redacted], Maryland, date of birth [redacted]

Files of the Credit Bureau, Incorporated, WDC, as of February 28, 1972, reflected that as of October 8, 1969, [redacted] was residing at [redacted] Maryland, and as of April 30, 1970, he was residing at [redacted] [redacted], WDC, and was employed as a [redacted] [redacted]. A former address was listed as [redacted], Colorado.

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The files of the National Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, when reviewed on April 24, 1972, disclosed the following information:

[redacted], born [redacted], at [redacted], West Virginia, and residing at [redacted], [redacted], Maryland, enlisted in the United States Army on [redacted], at Baltimore, Maryland, and entered on duty on [redacted], at Baltimore, Maryland, under Service Number RA [redacted].

His duty stations included Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, Fort Belvoir, Virginia, and Fort Carson, Colorado. On [redacted], he received an honorable early release to attend school at the University of Colorado, Colorado Springs,

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Colorado. At the time of his separation, he was transferred to the United States Army Reserves until [redacted].

His early separation resulted from a request which he had made on [redacted], stating that he had paid the entrance fee at the University of Colorado and had been accepted to attend the summer semester of the 1969 school year.

[redacted] held the rank of SP4, and was assigned to the Headquarters and Maintenance Support Company, 195th Maintenance Battalion, Fort Carson, Colorado, when he was separated from active duty in the Army. His specialty in the Army was that of "general craftsman".

The military records disclose [redacted] description as a white male, five feet seven inches tall, 143 pounds, brown hair, green eyes, marital status, single. His parents' names were listed as [redacted], born [redacted] in Pennsylvania (deceased), and [redacted], born 1923 in Pennsylvania. His stepfather, [redacted], was born [redacted], [redacted], Maryland, and at the time of [redacted] entrance into the Army, was residing at [redacted], Maryland.

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A fourth source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 11, 1972, that [redacted] was employed by [redacted]

[redacted] at which time he voluntarily left to do graduate work in college.

The first three sources, who previously furnished information of [redacted] affiliation with SESPA, advised during May, 1972, that they had heard nothing concerning any activity by [redacted] in SESPA or any other organization in recent months.
