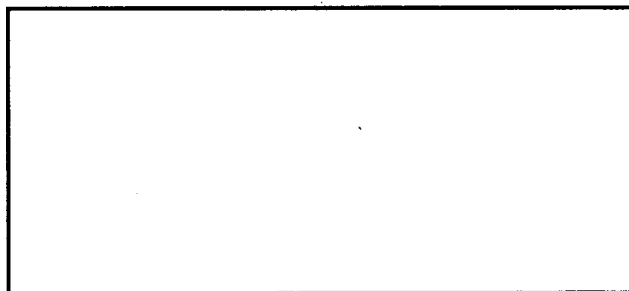

The files of the New York Office contain no pertinent  
subversive information identifiable with [redacted]

The LHM is being classified "~~Confidential~~" because  
the unauthorized disclosure of information furnished by [redacted]  
and [redacted], sources of continuing value, could reveal their  
identities, and could be prejudicial to the defense interest  
of the nation.

The activities of SESPA in the New York City area  
appear to be open, taking the form of protests mainly against  
the Riverside Research Institute by leafleting and demonstrating  
at that institute.

Available information indicates that SESPA in the New  
York City area is a non-violent, legitimate, pacifist-type  
organization, the stated purpose of which is "to get scientists  
and engineers to stop doing war work" and to get scientists to  
take an oath stating "I pledge that I will not participate in  
war research on weapons production. I further pledge to counsel  
my students and urge my colleagues to do the same".

In view of the above, no further investigation is  
being conducted by New York in this matter, and this case is  
being placed in a RUC status.

[redacted] advised on October 17, 1969 that during the NEW YORK course of the National Committee Meeting for the New University Conference (NUC) held September 26-28, 1969 at the University of Wisconsin, Madison; Wisconsin [redacted] name was mentioned as that of a Regional Organizer for the NUC and Organizer for the NUC.

1971-AFFILIATED WITH SUBJECT ORGANIZATION

A pamphlet distributed by the NUC in December, 1970, states that it is a national organization of graduate students, faculty, and staff whose members are "radicals committed to the growth of a revolutionary socialist movement in the U.S." NUC maintains a national office at 622 West Diversey, Chicago, Illinois.

On April 17, 1968, [ ] furnished a handbill published by the Faculty-Students Committee Against the War. The handbill was entitled "April Days and Strike", and announced that April 22-26 would be days of education, protest, and resistance against the war at the State University of New York (SUNY), Stony Brook, New York. It further indicated that a week-long program had been planned with outside speakers on Vietnam, China, the 1968 Election Campaign, and Black Liberation. b2 b7D

At the bottom of the handbill, recipients were referred for further information to seven faculty members, including Ted Goldfarb, Chemistry Department.

On October 5, 1971, [ ] advised that from 6:30 PM to 7:30 PM on October 6, 1971, SESPA would sponsor a picket-line type demonstration at the Americana Hotel, 52nd Street and Seventh Avenue, New York City, to display dissatisfaction with New York City Mayor John V. Lindsay and United States Senators George McGovern and Edmund Muskie, who were scheduled speakers at the Liberal Party Annual Dinner at the hotel.

On October 6, 1971, from 6:30 PM to 8:30 PM, Special Agents (SAs) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed six individuals in front of the Americana Hotel passing out statements entitled "John V. Lindsay is a Hawk", and signed by Rod Goldman, former Lindsay campaign worker for SESPA.

The statement stated that Mayor Lindsay is directly implicated with the barbarism in Southeast Asia through his relationship with the Riverside Research Institute (RRI), the largest weapons laboratory in New York City, and one of the largest in the country.

The "New York Post", a New York City daily newspaper, in its October 13, 1971 issue, on the "Letter to the Editor" page, contained an article by Deborah Wallace, PhD, for New York SESPA, entitled "Missiles and Mayors", which stated as follows:

N.Y.

"As a member of Scientists and Engineers for Social and Political Action (SESPA), I would like to clarify the issue behind our demonstration against Mayor Lindsay at the Liberal Party annual dinner.

"Mayor Lindsay's Science Advisory Council is controlled by the co-founders of Riverside Research Institute, New York's largest weapons lab. John Dunning and Lawrence O'Neill are the nucleus of what has become a kind of Kissinger cabinet to the Mayor. The Advisory Council and the Scientific Manpower Committee, of which Dunning is also chairman, are responsible for recommending technical personnel, for helping to solve such technical problems as power plants siting and public health issues and for advising the city administration on consultant contracts.

"Having these two-key advisory bodies controlled by men addicted to instruments of mass murder is questionable in itself. But these men are also capable of committing corrupt acts to keep Riverside Research Institute from folding through Defense Department cutbacks in the missile programs".

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SESPA

The "New York Post" in its October 12, 1971 issue, on Page 2 contained an article entitled "Scientists Picketing West Side War Lab", which stated in part as follows:

"Each week for the past year and a half several scientists have gathered on the West Side to picket a drab six-story brick building which is conspicuous only because of the three uniformed guards and the plainclothes security director who check employees' security passes at the door.

"The scientists, members of SESPA (Scientists and Engineers for Social and Political Action), are picketing the super-secret Riverside Research Institute, 80 West End Avenue at 64th St., which they believe is the city's largest weapons research lab.

"As have members in other cities, they have taken their SESPA pledge to oppose the use of science for warfare.

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[redacted] advised on November 4, 1971 that on the morning of that date, leaflets were distributed by SESPA on the campus of CU, New York City, calling for a noon demonstration at the residence of CU President, William J. McGill, Morningside Drive and 116th Street, New York City, inasmuch as SESPA claimed that CU was still secretly associated with the RRI and therefore assisting in war research for the Pentagon.

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## SESPA

The source stated that a picket-line type demonstration was held from noon until 1:00 PM at CU President McGill's residence on that date with approximately 15 persons participating. The group called for severance by CU with all military research and any company affiliated with military research.

The source advised that SESPA claimed that CU was operating a computer on the CU campus for the benefit of military research.

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On November 10, 1971, [ ] advised that [ ] of CU seemed to be in charge of the SESPA group at CU on November 4, 1971, during the demonstration at President McGill's residence, and that [ ] who participated in the demonstration, was currently active in the group.

[ ] advised on March 26, 1969 that at that time on a list of names and addresses of CU Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) members, there appeared the name of [ ] CU.

SDS was founded during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960's functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From a stance of "participatory democracy", the SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position. It maintained a national office at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois, until February, 1970. Internal factionalism during 1969 produced three main factions: Weatherman, Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), and Worker Student Alliance (WSA). The Weatherman and RYM no longer consider themselves associated with the SDS. The WSA faction continues to use the name SDS.

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SESPA

The "Columbia Daily Spectator", in its issue of December 1, 1971, contained an article entitled "RRI Computer Equipment Removed from CU Property", which stated that the last parts of the RRI computer were removed from CU property on the previous day.

The article further stated that the computer had been a favorite target for SESPA, which had been fighting the weapons research laboratory and CU's support of it for a number of years.

The article then stated that although the computer had been a major issue, SESPA's fight with CU was not over, according to David Wuchnich, a former RRI employee and SESPA member, who stated on the previous day that the university and RRI cooperate on a science honors program for talented high school students.

MEMBER-SUBJECT ORGANIZATION

On August 29, 1967, [redacted] made available material which reflected that [redacted] New York, had contributed the sum of \$15 to the National Conference for New Politics (NCNP) via a personal check number 7, drawn on the First National City Bank of New York. This source could furnish no information to indicate that subject held any position as a delegate to the National Convention of the NCNP or actually attended this convention held in Chicago, Illinois, from August 29, 1967 through September 4, 1967.

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SESPA

The June 10, 1966 issue of the "New York Times", a daily New York City newspaper, (Late City Edition), contained an article entitled "Coalition Formed to Back New Left at November Polls." This article stated that the NCNP had recently been formed by a new group of civil rights and anti-war militants to raise campaign funds for New Left candidates on a nation-wide basis. Included in the NCNP would be those professing adherence to the New Left, Reform Democrats, Democratic Party insurgents, groups who had disassociated themselves from the "old left" of the 1930s, pacifists, campus radicals and left-wing crusaders against American involvement in Vietnam.

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[redacted] advised on January 4, 1972 that at approximately 5:30 PM on December 22, 1971, a demonstration protesting the RRI's involvement in the Department of Defense research was held in front of the RRI, 80 West End Avenue, New York, New York, under the auspices of SESPA, a CU-based organization headed by [redacted].

The source then furnished information which in his opinion indicated that SESPA was threatening the RRI.

On February 8, 1972, [REDACTED] advised that he learned that on January 26, 1972, [REDACTED] telephonically informed the Hudson Institute, Quaker Ridge Road, Croton-on-Hudson, New York, which conducts policy research in the public interest, that there would be a peaceful demonstration outside the institute every Thursday at 12:00 noon by various pacifist and peace groups, including SESPA, because of the institute's Vietnam policy. N.Y.

AFFILIATED WITH SUBJECT ORGANIZATION

The source stated that he further learned that from [REDACTED] about 11:30 AM until 1:30 PM on January 27, 1972, about 12 persons, including [REDACTED] and two other young men from SESPA, conducted a peaceful demonstration at the Hudson Institute for the purpose of getting weapons scientists to obtain work in non-weapons industries.

The "Columbia Daily Spectator", in its March 3, 1972 issue, contained an article entitled "SESPA Protests Military Research", which stated in part as follows:

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SESPA

"Although military research by Columbia professors has not been an explosive issue recently, there are those on campus who maintain that "illegitimate ties" to the Institute for Defense Analysis still exist.

"On Wednesday, at noon, thirty people picketed Pupin Laboratory to protest the affiliation of five physics professors with the Jason Group of IDA, an organization of professors from universities who advise the Department of Defense in addition to their academic duties.

"The demonstration was organized by the Scientists and Engineers for Social and Political Action (SESPA), a group which has been protesting military research on campuses for the past two years. SESPA has charged the five professors with aiding the arms race as well as using Columbia's facilities and personnel to carry out their research. They have vowed to picket the laboratories at Pupin every Wednesday at noon to publicize their opposition to the research.

"According to one member of SESPA, the group is opposed to military research even if the Columbia facilities are not being used. 'Their research is not a legitimate academic pursuit', he stated.

"Deborah Wallace, a member of SESPA, asserted that the Defense Department uses the Jason Group to justify military escalation. 'A good example of this can be found in the Pentagon Papers', where we see that McNamara wanted some technological basis for a go-ahead in the bombing".

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On March 6, 1972, [ ] made available a copy of a leaflet captioned "Jason Kills", which stated in part as follows:

"The Jason Division of the Institute for Defense Analysis is an elite body of academics serving as unpaid special advisors to the Pentagon. The group consists of about 40 outstanding university scientists who devote as much of their available time as possible to studies in the 'vanguard' of the scientific aspects of defense problems. In its first years, Jason members concentrated on theoretical analyses of ballistic missile defense and exoatmospheric detonations. In 1964, however, a new excursion was made. Increased government attention to such problems as counter-insurgency, insurrection and infiltration led to the suggestion that Jason members might be able to provide fresh insights into problems that are not entirely in the realm of physical science. As part of this 'excursion', Jason in 1967 held a secret conference on Thailand with the intent of mobilizing university social scientists for US counter-insurgency operations in that country. Thus the 1967 Annual Report of IDA notes that 'Jason continued work on technical problems of counter-insurgency warfare and systems studies with relevance to Biet Nam'. These studies led to among other things, the system of electronic detectors dropped along the Ho Chi Minh trail to detect truck convoys for air attack. Most of these trucks are driven by young Vietnamese Women".

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SESPA

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In addition, this leaflet stated that a picket line to protest Jason at CU would be held on March 1, 1972, at noon, and every Wednesday thereafter in front of the CU Pupin Laboratory, under the sponsorship of SESPA.

On March 6, 1972, [ ] made available a copy of a leaflet entitled "An Open Letter to Columbia's Jason Group", issued by the New York Chapter of SESPA. This leaflet, which is addressed "Gentlemen", stated in part as follows:

"It is almost seven years since Lyndon Johnson ordered massive escalation in Vietnam. It is over twenty-five years since the United States accepted nuclear genocide as a legitimate means of national defense.

"Since the late 1950's the Jason Division of the Institute for Defense Analysis has been the spearhead of military penetration into the American scientific community. A list of Jason members is virtually a who's-who of US science. It is in addition a public endorsement of American defense policies, including the Vietnam war and national defense by genocide. If this were all, if Jason were just the equivalent of a pro-war New York Times advertisement, we would be obliged to ignore you. But Jason is more. The list of your projects reads like a preview of the next Nurenberg Tribunal. Your recruitment of graduate students for the Department of Defense fully justifies their faith in you as their most prestigious scientific advisors.

"You have, in short, used your professional scientific skills to aid the military. In that you implicate us, your colleagues, with your murderous work. In that you violate even the most elementary view of professional ethics in science.

"We call on you to resign from the Jason Division of the Institute of Defense Analysis."

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• [ ] advised on March 14, 1972 that a rally was being planned for 12:00 noon on that date at the CU Sundial, New York City, to draw the attention of students and faculty to the demands of a coalition of various CU campus groups, including SESPA, regarding the release of a research study conducted by the CU School of International Affairs (SIA) for the United States State Department on the post-war development of South Vietnam.

The source stated that at noon on March 14, 1972 about 50 persons assembled at the Sundial at CU, and at 12:15 PM marched to 118th Street and Amsterdam Avenue, the location of the SIA building, where they conducted a peaceful sit-in outside of the office of Ruth Russell, administrator of the contract for SIA, until 4:30 PM.

The "Columbia Daily Spectator", in its March 15, 1972, issue contained an article entitled "Sixty-March on SIA-Building To Protest Vietnam Contract", which stated in part as follows:

"About sixty students representing a coalition of radical groups staged a three-and-a-half hour sit-in at the School of International Affairs yesterday to protest the school's State Department contract to study the post-war development of Vietnam.

"The sit-in took place on the fourteenth floor of the SIA building, outside the office of Ruth Russell, the administrator of the contract. The radicals had marched to the building after a noon rally at the Sundial with the intention of confronting Ms. Russell and demanding that she allow them to see the completed report."

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SESPA

The SMC publicly describes itself as the largest organization of American antiwar youth. It organizes mass actions to fight for the total, immediate and unconditional withdrawal of all United States troops and material from Southeast Asia. SMC is controlled by the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), which has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450. b2 b7D

On May 19, 1972, [ ] advised that a picket-line demonstration would take place in front of the RRI, 80 West End Avenue, New York City, from 4:30 PM to 5:30 PM on that date, under the sponsorship of SESPA, to protest the designing of radar equipment by the RRI, which is used in the war in Indo-China.

On May 19, 1972, SAs of the FBI observed a picket-line demonstration in front of the RRI, 80 West End Avenue, New York City, from 4:30 PM to 5:30 PM. Eight persons participated in the demonstration, and each handed out statements signed by SESPA alleging that the RRI was part of the "air war" in Indo-China because the RRI conducted research for radar equipment used in the Indo-China War. The statement urged RRI employees to quit their jobs and not continue to support the Pentagon.

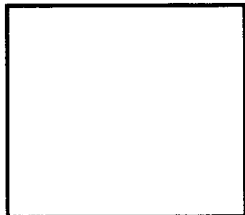

WORLD FEDERATION OF SCIENTIFIC WORKERS

On February 27, 1972, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that a group known as Scientists and Engineers for Social and Political Action (SESPA) is a national organization of persons involved in scientific or engineering fields. SESPA is a loosely knit national group which organizes chapters in various United States cities. Each chapter has its own name and operates independently from other chapters. SESPA produces its own national magazine known as "Science for the People." On a national basis, this organization participates in three types of activities: 1.) the publication of its national magazine, 2.) disruption of national meetings of professional organizations, and 3.) the participation in a program to furnish North Vietnam with scientific data and research information.
