L.A. SCIENTISTS AND ENGINEERS FOR SOCIAL AND POLITICAL ACTION, AKA: COMPUTER PROFESSIONALS FOR PEACE (CPP): CAMPAIGN AGAINST PERSONNEL SECURITY CLEARANCES

- I. A reliable source has reported that persons associated with "L.A. Scientists and Engineers for Social and Political Action", AKA: "Computer Professionals For Peace (CPP)" are planning a public campaign against military investigative agencies conducting personnel security clearance investigations on civilians employed by industries engaged in defense contracts.
- employee at TRW Systems, and employee at Systems Development Corporation, both members of Computer Professionals For Peace (CPP), have reportedly held meetings at home, where they have conducted planning sessions for a campaign against government use of computers to compile information on individuals requiring personnel security clearances.
- 3. has reportedly stated that the Office of Special Investigations (OSI) compiles dossiers which are turned over to Defense Industrial Security Clearance Office (DISCO) and Industrial Security Clearance Review Office (ISCRO). will reportedly attempt to gain support for a public campaign against this type of activity.

of "Pentegon Papers" fame, has attended several of these meetings.

Present plans are to have make several public speeches exposing how the various military investigative agencies investigate: civilians employed by industries who do defense contact work in an attempt to gain support.

- Senator Alan Cranston. To date, the meetings have been unorganized with a lot of arguments between members on how to proceed. has asked members to do various research projects to show how the Federal, State and local governments use computers to compile these dossiers. Most members at the present time appear not to have necessary time required to devote to such a project.
